There was serious landslide in Cachar, Dima Hasao & Meghalaya border on 25/26th June 2012 affecting rail traffic to Barak Valley, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura. The Govt. Departments viz. PWD (R), PHE, etc. are engaged for restoration of road communications and other essential services.

Deployed in 13 Districts viz., Barpeta, Dhemaji, Dibrugarh, Dima-Hasao, Jorhat (Majuli), Kamrup, Kamrup (Metro), N. Lakhimpur, Nagaon, Nalbari, Sibsagar, Sonitpur and Tinsukia. 7 Teams of Army Deployed in Barpeta, Dhemaji, Dima-Hasao, Sibsagar, Sonitpur and Tinsukia Districts 18 teams of SDRF have also been placed in various districts. Air force is extending necessary help. 	

State Government is taking steps to pay ex-gratia of Rs.1.50 Lakh to the next of kin of each deceased person. PMO has announced ex-gratia payment of Rs.1.00 Lakh. Hon'ble CM has also announced Rs.1.00 Lakh to the next of kin of the deceased person from CM's Relief Fund.
